Where Do I Vote?

Help for Public in Finding Their Polling Station

CALGARY– Calgary 2026 Bid Corporation (BidCo) said today it wants to help ensure Calgarians are aware of where they need to vote in Tuesday’s plebiscite. The public is being asked the specific question in the polling booth November 13th: are you for or are you against Calgary hosting the 2026 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games?

“We’ve held 40 events this week, including an internet town hall call for 9,500 people and folks still seem unsure of how and where to vote,” noted Susan Veres, Calgary 2026 Vice-President Marketing & Communications. “Hopefully the media can help spread the word so Calgarians can get out and exercise their democratic right.”

The best way for people to find out where they can cast their vote is at www.calgary.ca/vote2018. Directly from this page there is a button to find your polling station, which are open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. In order to vote, you must bring a piece of ID containing your name and current address. Picture ID is not required. With website traffic expected to increase substantially over the next couple of days, it is a good idea to check the location of your polling station early.

Calgary 2026 continues to engage with the public this weekend through a number of events including a large family free skate at the Olympic Oval. Outreach will continue Monday as well.
